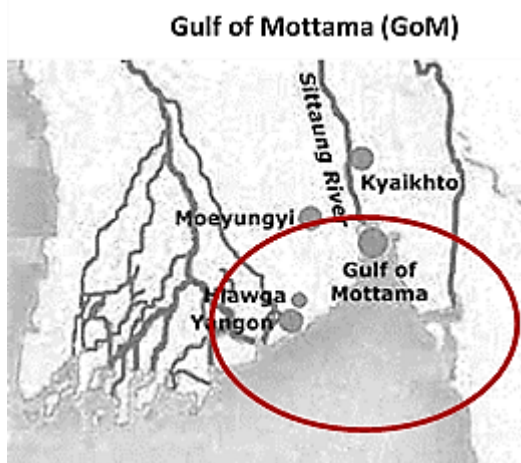

Summary

Duration	3 Years – February 2015 to April 2018
Overarching goal	The Unique Biodiversity of the Gulf of Mottama is conserved and sustainably developed in order to benefit human communities that depend on it
Specific project goal	Vulnerable women and men in targeted coastal areas of the Gulf of Mottama have improved livelihood security through effective fisheries value chain development, livelihoods diversification and equitable and sustainable management of resources
Outcomes	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Benefits of sustainable fisheries management in the Gulf of Mottama area are shared through effective value chains and equitable market access2. Vulnerable coastal communities have increased income through livelihood diversification and improved access to non-fisheries resources3. The special habitats of the GoM are sustainably and equitably managed on the basis of clear scientific information and through integrated local, regional and national institutions/management bodies

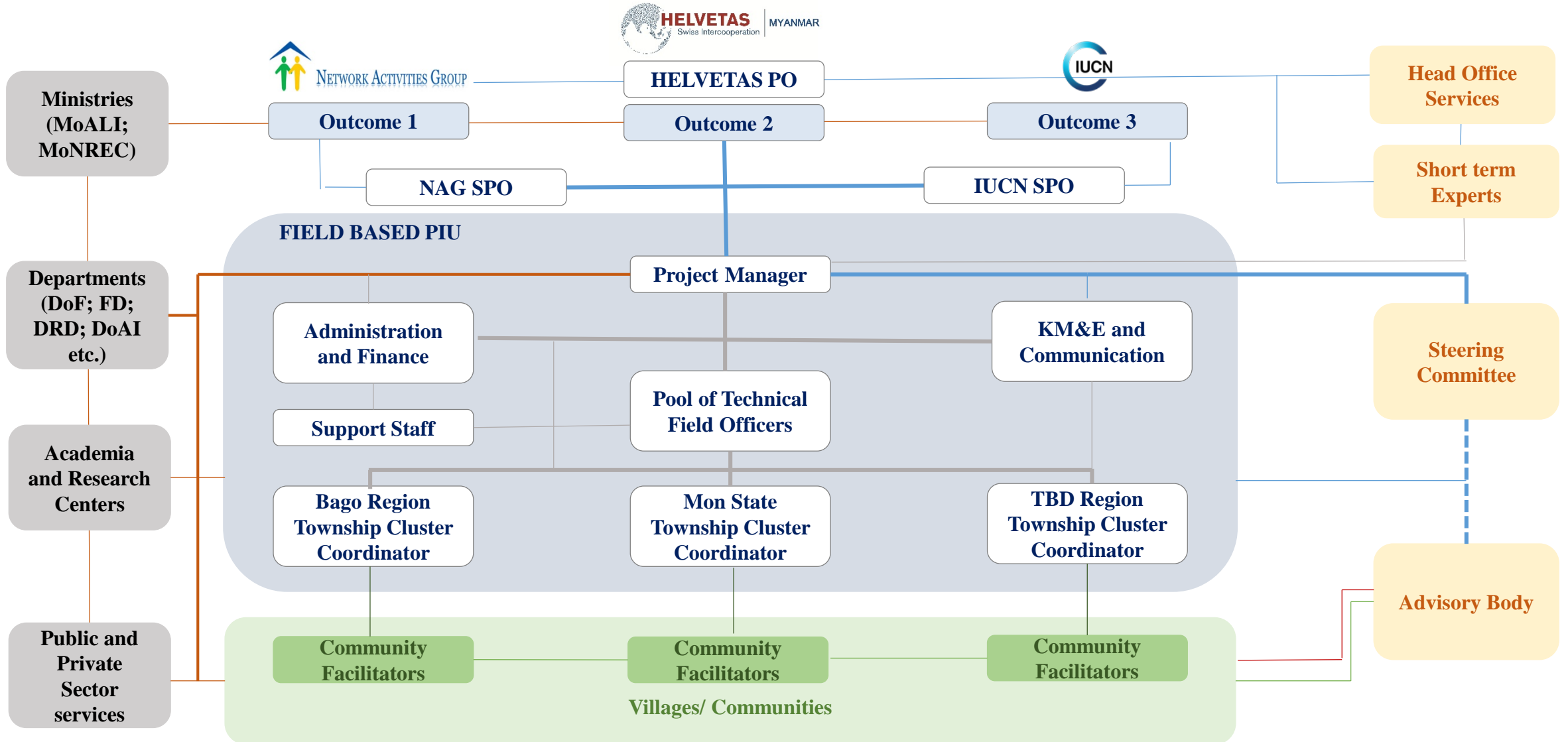

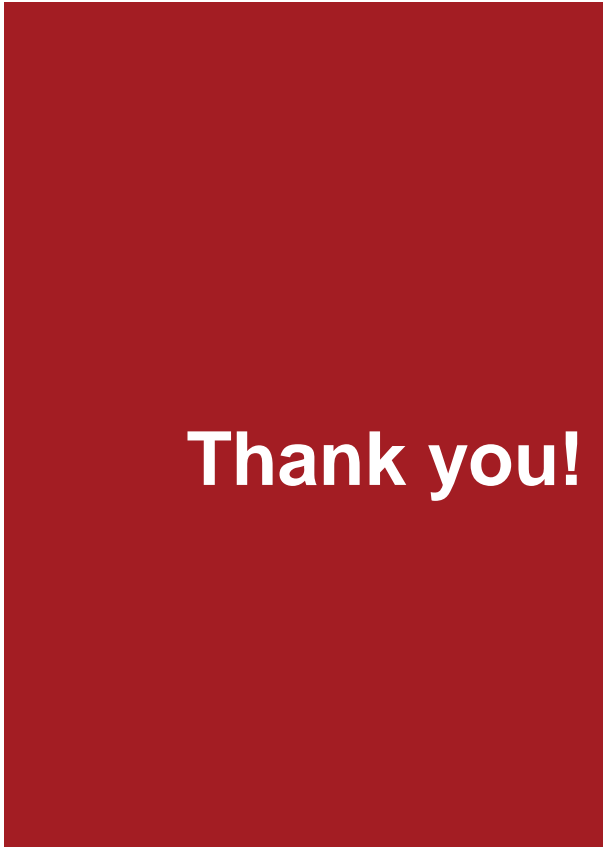
